POLICY STATEMENT

Register to Vote

The University of Valley Forge will make voter registration forms and information available to every student on an annual basis.

Constitution Day

The institution will hold an educational program pertaining to the U.S. Constitution on September 17 of each year or the closest weekday if the 17th falls on a weekend.

REASON FOR POLICY

- 1. Federal law requires the University of Valley Forge to make voter registration forms available to every student.
- Educational institutions receiving Federal funding are required to hold an educational program
 pertaining to the United States Constitution on September 17 of each year or the closest weekday if
 the 17th falls on a weekend.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Each year, the institution provides voter registration information to all students.
- 2. The institution provides educational programming on Constitutional history and issues to all students.

PROCEDURES

1. Each year, the institution makes voter registration information available to students. The Storms Research Center provides students with a link to an online voter registration form, as well as a link to information about absentee ballots, registration deadlines for each state and a link to the Constitution Day and Voter Registration LibGuide, which includes an FAQ list that guides students through being eligible to vote, registering, and applying for an absentee ballot.

2. The Storms Research Center celebrates Constitution Day each year in the library. This is celebrated with a book display, decorations, and trivia. The Constitution Day and Voter Registration LibGuide is available to all students and can be found at https://libguides.valleyforge.edu/constitution.
