Analysis/Interpretation (Consideration):

Behavioral Sciences

Dr. Falk highlighted that student performance improved when assignments were scaffolded and presented with greater clarity. The department intends to continue “chunking” assignments to support student comprehension and success. Additionally, allowing students to select their own topics was shown to increase engagement and performance.

However, challenges remain. Dr. Falk noted that many students struggled with proper APA citation, often blending citation styles inconsistently. Online students faced difficulties related to limited contact compared to their on-campus peers. Furthermore, a significant number of students did not utilize academic support services available through the University of Valley Forge.

Following the 2023 reset of the Communication, Methods, and Measurement (CMM) framework, Dr. Falk indicated that only minor adjustments to assignment titles were necessary. No formal proposals were submitted to the PSLO Committee at this time.

Business

Dr. Gearhart identified several recurring challenges, including difficulties in assessment reporting, the need for improved training for adjunct faculty on assessment procedures, and a lack of clarity surrounding expectations in MOL 690, particularly regarding thesis completion. Additionally, students in the Sport Management program demonstrated a need for further development in verbal communication and PowerPoint presentation skills.

To address these concerns, Dr. Gearhart proposed the following actions:

1. Provide additional assessment training for adjunct faculty.
2. Add defined cut scores to the department’s assessment matrices.
3. Issue timely reminders to faculty at the start of each semester regarding the use of embedded assessments, to ensure the correct tools are implemented and results are accurately recorded.
4. These measures aim to strengthen assessment practices and support student achievement. No formal proposals were submitted to the PSLO Committee at this time.

Digital Media Communications

Faculty discussion highlighted a recurring issue across multiple courses and focus areas: students consistently struggled with planning and adapting their plans for semester-long project assignments. Additional discussion addressed the effectiveness of group project work in meeting interpersonal skills outcomes, with specific attention given to how these are assessed. The department also raised broader curricular questions for

both the PSLO and General Education Student Learning Outcomes (GESLO) Committees regarding the adequacy of technology-focused coursework in preparing students for evolving workplace demands.

Further conversation examined when assignment scaffolding (“chunking”) ceases to be beneficial—particularly the distinction between its value in introductory versus capstone courses.

The following changes were submitted to the PSLO Committee and were approved:

1. PSLO Assessment Cycle: A proposed shift to assess PSLOs 1, 3, and 5 in odd years and PSLOs 2, 4, and 6 in even years was reconsidered after review of the department’s Curriculum Matrix. The department will continue to collect and analyze data for PSLOs 1 through 6 each academic year.
2. PSLO 2 Update: COM 373 (Design and Visual Language) has been removed from the curriculum and will be replaced by CMS 107 (Fundamentals of AI and Machine Learning) as the course aligned to PSLO 2.
3. PSLO 5 Update – Course Addition: CMS 408 (AI Capstone) will be added as a direct assessment measure for students in the new Digital Media – Applied AI major.
4. PSLO 5 Description Revision: The revised PSLO 5 description reads: “Students will develop and produce digital media products integrating information through writing, audio, design, photography, video, AI tools, and web design using a variety of modern technologies.”
5. PSLO 6 Update – Direct Measure Addition: CMS 408 (AI Capstone) will also be added as a direct measure for PSLO 6.

Education

Graduate students were frequently reported to feel disconnected from their professors, and many demonstrated limited responsiveness to feedback provided on assignments. Among undergraduate students, there was a consistent pattern of students feeling overwhelmed as the semester progressed, particularly toward the end of the term.

The following recommendations were submitted to the PSLO Committee and were accepted:

1. PSLO 2 – Evidence Classification: The Pennsylvania Department of Education’s PDE 430 evaluation form, previously classified as indirect evidence, will now serve as direct evidence of student learning.
2. PSLO 3 – Assessment Adjustment: The assessment used to measure PSLO 3 in EDU 503 (Curriculum Theory and Design) was revised. The new measure is Assignment-Level Assessment (ALA) 2 from Week 2 of the course.
3. PSLO 5 – Instrument Update: The self-evaluation form used by student teachers was revised to improve clarity and alignment with PSLO 5.

Intercultural Studies

Dr. Totire noted that recent meetings with Academic Affairs were instrumental in providing the guidance needed to update the department’s Curriculum and Assessment Matrix from the previous year. Several recurring themes emerged from the assessment data. These included a need to revise rubrics used for evaluating student performance, a tendency among students to delay meeting with faculty until late in the semester, and ongoing issues with late assignment submissions.

Aside from the updates to the assignment rubrics, no additional changes to the department’s Communication, Methods, and Measurement (CMM) framework were proposed at this time.

Ministry Leadership and Theology

Several key themes emerged from the assessment process. These included the need to notify faculty earlier regarding assessment responsibilities, a discussion about whether to revise the benchmark score for the Assemblies of God Credentialing Exam, and concerns about students’ preparedness for graduate-level academic work. Additionally, the department identified a recurring issue regarding students’ uncertainty about how to contact the university librarian, Melanie Oestreich.

In response to this concern, Melanie Oestreich—supported by Kristianna Nye, Instructional Designer and Faculty Support—recommended including librarian contact information in course syllabi. This proposal was received positively and will undergo further review for implementation.

Music

Benchmarks for PSLOs 1 through 4, as well as PSLO 6, have remained consistent over time. However, variability was observed in results for PSLOs 5 and 6 in different contexts. Several trends emerged from the assessment data, including a lack of foundational music notation reading skills among incoming freshmen, difficulties with planning assignments in advance, and a tendency for music majors to change majors after initial academic setbacks.

Additional areas of concern included struggles with MLA in-text citation formatting, insufficient practice hours on secondary instruments, and delays in submitting thesis drafts.

The following PSLO-related course description revisions were submitted and approved by the PSLO Committee:

1. PSLO 3 – Modification of course wording for MED 466 (Student Teaching)

2. PSLO 4 – Modification of course wording for MED 433
3. PSLO 4 – Additional update for MED 466 (Student Teaching)
4. PSLO 5 – Revisions to CHM/MED courses aligned with this outcome
5. PSLO 6 – Wording update for MED 466 (Student Teaching)

Arts & Sciences

Several recurring themes were observed across assessments. Students commonly demonstrated low confidence and self-esteem during presentations, and there were persistent issues with formality in writing, including grammar, diction, and MLA formatting. Despite these challenges, notable positive trends emerged. Artificial Intelligence tools were found to be effective in encouraging creative thinking among students, and prior learning was successfully incorporated into literary analysis assignments. However, concerns remain regarding the articulation of a Christian Worldview, with noted disconnects between faculty expectations and student responses.

Professor Weaver presented the following adjustment with approval from the PSLO Committee:

Changing the wording to the PSLO percentage for the Capstone.

Common Themes

Throughout the meeting, several common themes emerged across academic departments:

1. The need for additional assessment training for adjunct faculty.
2. Online course syllabi should replace outdated WRITE Solution references with current MS Teams meeting links or guidelines.
3. Concerns were raised about the process of updating Curriculum and Assessment Matrices (CMMs), how to appropriately group assessments that span summer courses, and the need for rubric revisions.
4. All faculty teaching the same course sections should use the same rubric for assessing direct measures to maintain consistency.
5. Students often demonstrate weak project planning, execution, and time management skills.
6. There is an ongoing need to review and apply best practices for group work to improve outcomes and assess interpersonal skills.
7. While breaking larger assignments into smaller “chunked” components helps early-level students succeed, questions remain about whether this approach may hinder independence in upper-level or capstone courses.
8. Questions were raised about whether current PSLO and General Education Student Learning Outcome (GESLO) technology training adequately prepares students for real-world workforce demands.
9. Oral communication remains an area of concern, with students showing a lack of confidence and structure in verbal presentations.
10. Distance learners often fail to respond to faculty feedback—possibly due to issues with receiving or noticing Canvas notifications.
